Welcome to our nursery news!

Our sound of the week is 'w' and so we have been learning words which begin with this initial sound. During phonics sessions we have also been playing with sounds and exploring how sounds are articulated.

In literacy this week we have been creating sea creature puppets which we then used to develop conversation. This activity linked to our pathway's topic, 'The whale who wanted more'. We have also noticed how our children are developing their self-confidence to speak out in front of a small group of peers. We chose our favourite sea creatures and discussed their properties and characteristics within a group-Well done Ercall!



During our maths sessions this week we have been comparing the sizes of sea creatures, shell sorting-looking at patterns/shapes and we have been on a spring walk around the whole school area, counting flowers and observing colour.

We have been very creative this week too and enjoyed painting with the sea creatures- lots of messy fun! Well done all of you!

This week we have enjoyed starting our new English unit where we will be looking at environmental issues and the part we can play in making a difference to our world.
