<u>Ercall</u>

We are enjoying our week in nursery.

We have all shown an interest in the pond which is in our forest school area.

The children observe how the tadpoles are developing each week.

Following this interest we have created a tuff tray with 'five little speckled frogs' as the theme.

We challenged the children to match the numerals to the correct amount of frogs.

In literacy we have been exploring our Supertato topic further- suggesting ideas to rescue the vegetables and using descriptive language to describe Supertato.

In maths we have been exploring numbers and counting. We matched the numbers of cars to the numerals up to five then used white board pens to trace over the numbers.

In our outdoor provision we created a bug tray full of insects, logs, magnifying glasses and bug books. The children completed a real bug hunt following this activity.







We went on a phonics sound hunt this week where all our sounds were written on 'peas'. The children were encouraged to match the phoneme to an object from the Supertato story.

Finally, we all decorated a 'green pea biscuit' and recognised other objects of the same colour.

<u>Lawley</u>

This week, Lawley have been learning more about the human and physical geography in China. We enjoyed looking at pictures and videos of the diverse geography of the county. We were amazed by the Huangshan Mountains and the bustling cities of Shanghai and Beijing. Next week we will be writing postcards from our virtual trip to China.

In maths we have been learning about place value in numbers to 100. I have been really impressed with their place value knowledge of tens and ones. They have been using the base 10 equipment to represent numbers within 100 and show 1 more or 1 less.

In literacy this week we have started planning our own versions of Goldilocks and just the 1 bear, we are going to change the character and the setting so the children have been thinking carefully about which woodland animal they will write about and where they are going to get lost. Lots of great ideas and I can't wait to see their finished stories.

This week we have been over learning our class text 'Grandad's Secret Giant'. One of the ways we did this was to play Story Tennis, where we take it in turns with a partner to say a part of the story. What a great week to do this with it being Wimbledon week too!

















In Maths we have been learning about how we can record and find information in a variety

of graphs and tables such as tally's, block diagrams and pictographs. We have moved on this week to look at how the key for a pictogram could show that one image represents 2, 5 or even 10 rather than just a single unit.

We have also been learning about the Grimm brothers this term. We have enjoyed reading some of their tales, such as The Elves and the Shoemaker. This week we looked at the lives of the brothers and created fact files on what we had found out.



Children aged from 4 to 12 across Shropshire are being encouraged to join in the fun and games of this year's Summer Reading Challenge happening across at libraries in the county.

Young readers can join a superstar team and their marvellous mascots and get involved in the Ready Set Read Summer Reading Challenge which is themed around the power of play, sport, games and physical activity.

Through taking part in the challenge, with free materials from Shropshire Council's libraries and online via the challenge website, children will be encouraged to keep their minds and bodies active over the summer break.

The characters – brought to life by children's author and illustrator Loretta Schauer – navigate a fictional summer obstacle course and track their reading as they go, rewarded by free incentives including stickers.

Shropshire Council's libraries service will be running Summer Reading Challenge activities and events at all its branches from Saturday 8 July until Friday 15 September 2023.

The Summer Reading Challenge has been running since 1999 and helps to improve children's reading skills and confidence over the summer holidays, ensuring they are ready for their return to school.
