Antibullying week



Last week we participated in national antibullying week. The children started the week by celebrating our differences with odd sock day, we recognised each other's different talents and achievements and learnt the importance of respecting our differences while remembering we are all in this together.

The theme of this year's antibullying week was 'Make some noise'. Too often, people are silent when they see bullying take place, silent about the hurt bullying causes,

and silent when they hear bullying dismissed as 'just banter'. Together, we can make a difference and take a stand against bullying.

During worships, we learnt the difference between banter 'a playful and friendly exchange of teasing remarks' and bullying 'The repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological. It can take place face to face or online'

Lucy our Mental health support worker joined us to explore what a healthy relationship is, we realised that we may have different talents and interests to our friends, but that true friendship is built on trust and mutual respect. We discussed what to do if we accidently upset a friend, how to correct mistakes that we may all make from time to time and that all friendships have their ups and downs.














Monday 11th December
