#### **Music Matters**

What a busy term. The young musicians at Moreton Say have been enjoying their music lessons, singing in Worship, learning to play instruments with our visiting music tutors, coming to Music Clubs and attending Young Voices in Birmingham.

In Worship we have been introducing a piece, an instrument or an artist each week and listening to music as we come in and leave the hall. This term the music has included Imagine' by John Lennon and Yoko Ono, Strauss Waltzes, John Denver's 'Country Roads.' and songs from 'The Lion King'

#### **Music Lessons**

Wrekin class have been exploring music and dance from Africa. Listening to a talking drum helped them to use instruments to have rhythmical conversations. They loved exploring tempo by singing 'A Ram Sam Sam' which keeps on speeding up and is very energetic. The famous Thula Baba lullaby from South Africa made us all feel calm whilst the energy of an Afro Beat band made us all jump up and dance. We have also started to read music by following a score to add body percussion to 'Twinkle Twinkle Little Star.'

Caradoc have been learning some new notes on the recorder and getting really good at writing down rhythms and reading music. They've also been exploring steel drum music. We have been memorising Samba rhythms and are hoping to take our Samba band outside as soon as the weather allows. It was interesting to learn about carnivals which take place before Lent each year, especially as we also enjoyed eating the lovely pancakes organised by the PTA.

Stiperstones have listened to several versions of a Viking folk song called 'My Mother Told Me' to help them create, rehearse and perform their own Viking Song. Using a drone on the keyboard, a pulse on the drum, a repeated rhythm (ostinato) on percussion instruments and finally memorising the lyrics, everyone is looking forward to performing their compositions after half term.

# **Music Clubs**

28 children attended our Young Voices Choir Club and we had a great time in Birmingham at the Young Voices concert.

Some children have asked if they can practise their instruments at school and so we are offering a free drop in club every Thursday lunchtime up to Easter. It's called 'Practise makes Perfect' and will take place from 12.30 to 1.00 in Caradoc classroom. Initially it will be for any child who is learning an instrument in or out of school. We have a keyboard, guitars and ukuleles in school that can be used. Children can also bring in their own instruments.

#### Children's Mental Health Week


Launched by Place2Be in 2015, the week exists to empower, equip and give a voice to every child in the UK. This year's theme was My Voice Matters.

We were excited to see our children to come into school on Monday to kick start our mental health week wearing something that 'expresses themselves', there was a huge range of different sporting kits and lots of sparkle!

Our aim for the week was to help our children know they have the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. To ensure that our children feel listened to and know that they're not alone. During assembly we played a 'last to sing' game and realised how hard it is to be the only voice speaking up but that it can become easier when others around us are speak up too.

Lucy, our mental health support worker was in school on Thursday. She spoke to us about using our voice to create the change we want to see. Sometimes our voice can make a big difference in the world, but equally important is the way we use our voice to make a difference in small, everyday ways. She shared some stories about children who have used their voice for change around the world.

Our school will be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday 7th March 2023. We have planned some special reading activities to promote reading, share with children what a joy reading can be and remind them how reading can open up new worlds to them.
