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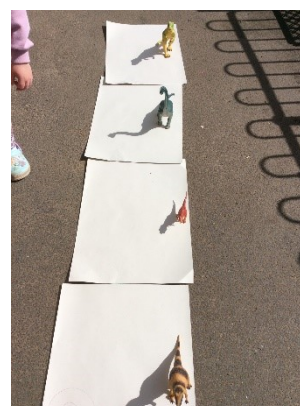


The children had fun problem solving, trying to break the dinosaurs free from the ice, we had some great ideas such as "warm water".

## Lawley

This week we have been sooooo egg-xited that our dinosaur eggs have started cracking! We are really hoping they are going to fully hatch next week so that we can look after our baby dinosaurs.

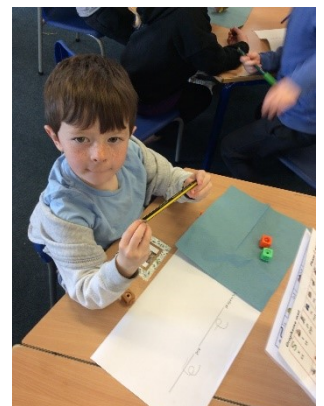
In provision this week the children have been practising their subitising and they have enjoyed playing with the playdough that they made last week in Art. We linked our playdough into maths using it for the dinosaur ten frames, they have been rolling their playdough into balls to make counters for the ten frames. They then used these to look at number bonds. We have seen some lovely maths language being used this week in provision. Well done everyone.

We have been continuing our Giganotosaurus topic book this week and the children have wrote a letter this week looking at all its features. We are super proud of the children's writing this week seeing lots of longer words being sounded out and sentences developing using the connective 'and'. This week we have looked at adjectives to describe foods the dinosaurs might have eaten. We came up with some silly food suggestions and the children enjoyed writing them.

In Science we have continued looking at camouflage and the children have been painting their model dinosaur structures they made last week using camouflaged colours. We then went outside to see if they were camouflaged with our environment.

Maths we have been looking at composition this week. The children had 5 counters with their partner to start with. Partners hid some counters under the paper towels and they had to then remember how many made five with the ones that were left. This showed good subitising and composition skills.

A great week Reception we are all really proud of you.

### Wrekin

This week we have been exploring our book 'The Last Wolf', through a range of activities, such as role play and conscious alley. We imagined what it would have been like for the last remaining animals in the 'good old days' and what it might be like, living in a tiny cottage with a bear, a wolf and a lynx. Through the use of conscious alley we were able to develop a persuasive argument for why the animals should, or should not eat Little Red.



In History we continued to find out about the monarchy. This week explored how William the Conqueror became king by looking at the Bayeux Tapestry online. We couldn't imagine how big 70 metres was, so we went outside and measured it. We went up, across and back down our entire field! Wow!

### Caradoc

In science, the children have set up their experiments. Taking responsibility for planning, setting up and recording. We look forward to seeing which of our plant thrive over the next few weeks and if our predictions about what plants need for growth were correct.

### Forest school

Year 4s took our science outside, learning about different roots structures. We dug up and sorted tap roots and fibrous roots plants before drawing and painting them. We also helped some poor pot bond plants by repotting and planting out. Adderley should be fully in bloom by the time we have finished all this planting!





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Year 3s used clay to make models taking inspiration from forest around them. They continued developing den building and knot tying skills, creating even more adventurous structures. Miss Archer was really impressed with how everyone has grown in confidence when exploring the outside environment, using tools and working together.

**Stiperstones**

We have been really enjoying our Computing work this term as we have been using Google Draw to create Vector drawings. We have looked at how we can use very basic shapes to create quite complex designs. We have managed to use many features on the programme in order to change shapes, resize shapes, layer shapes, use zoom to add more intricate detail and rotate shapes. The children all have a log-in so they can access this tool at home if they wish.

We have learning about the Muslim faith during our RE and what it means to be a Muslim in Britain today. We have found out about the five Pillars of Islam and have focused on the





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Hajj, through this exploration we now know what the pilgrimage to Mecca entails and why it is such an important part of the faith. We watched a video of a young Muslim girl planning her upcoming pilgrimage and thought about it thought about what the experience might be like.

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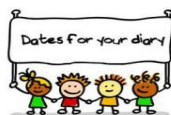


**Maths mastery workshop – Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> April, 2pm-3pm.**

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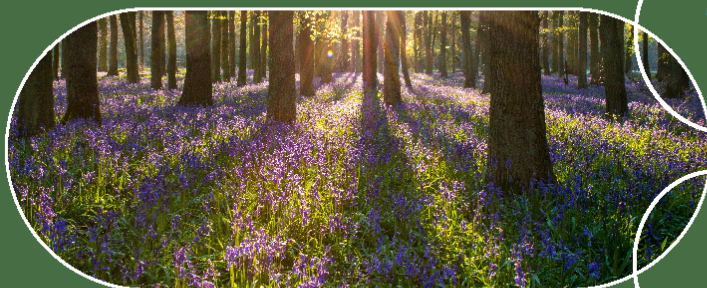
