





Ercall

This week in Nursery the children have been enjoying our Gigantosaurus story, we were even lucky enough to have a visit from a dinosaur!

The children then drew dinosaurs in their topic books, they did so well describing what they had drawn e.g. spikes, long tail, bumps.





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In maths time we have been busy colour matching the dinosaurs to their eggs, we also made a height chart to see who was the tallest and shortest in the class.

In phonics we have been learning the initial sound 'w' recognising the sound in wig, web and wave.

The children have enjoyed looking for dinosaurs and eggs in the soil using tweezers and spoons developing their fine motor skills, we all got very messy playing with the dinosaurs in baked beans, we used this as the lava from the volcano in the story.



We all enjoyed planting sunflower seeds for the children to grow at home, we would love a photo of them when they grow!

I'm sure the children would have told you all about our new garage and cars, we have had great turn taking and sharing.

We have had another busy week in Reception, and we have been enjoying getting out in our garden more now that the sun is shining. We want to thank Mrs Rawsthorne this week for running such a wonderful Maths Parent Workshop. The children loved showing off their subitising, composition and cardinality skills. It was wonderful to see such a great turn out and children working in groups having great confidence in their maths. Thank you for joining us.



The Mastery Number 'home packs' will be coming home for the next 5 weeks on a Thursday along with your child's reading and phonics recap sheet. It would be great if you could practise these a few times a week for 5 minutes to build up your child's confidence and maths skills.

In Art the children have enjoyed designing their animals that they will be sculpting out of clay in the next few weeks. Science has been super exciting this week we have been looking at fossils and where fossils come from. The children had chance to explore some fossils in the classroom and to be palaeontologist in our Role Play Area. Next week will be continuing to make and look at fossils.



In English and Phonics we have been writing adjectives to describe the characters in our topic book 'Gigantosaurus'. The children's writing has been wonderful this week. We are really focusing on perfecting our handwriting and the children have enjoyed doing this in provision in the sand and glitter. In Phonics we are continuing to practise Phase 3 sounds in our Phase 4 lesson to embed these sounded into our writing. We also had a visit this week from a Gigantosaurus and the children were so excited and amazed at our class visitor. The dinosaur was really kind and didn't scare us.

Wrekin

How exciting! This week we came into school to see that the Great Tits, Apple and Strudel, had hatched 9 of their 10 eggs. We have been excitedly watching how Mum and Dad are busily coming back and forth with tasty food for the hungry and noisy chicks. We are now watching Pixie and Puck, the Blue Tits, as they continue to sit on 11 tiny eggs.



Our classroom is a hive of activity at the moment. We are learning about what plants need and have created mini wildflower gardens, alongside a sweet pepper, tomato and strawberry plant! We will also be planting sunflowers and hopefully a magic beanstalk over the coming weeks.



We continued our maths learning into the forest this week, where we explored capacity and volume. Understanding the difference between the two and reading scales in varying intervals.

Caradoc

This week in English, we have been developing skills to write descriptive paragraphs on the girl entering the citadel in our topic book 'Journey'. This is a wordless book and we have had to build our own vocabulary to create the story. The children have created word banks of noun phrases, adverbs and prepositions to add interest and detail. We have been continuing the castle theme in our design technology where we have started to build our own defensive structures using nets of different 3D shapes.

Forest school

The year 4 children have explored different types of seeds and dispersal, we explored the grounds to find different examples of seeds and thought about how they were dispersed. We learnt about why seeds need to spread out to avoid competition for nutrients, water and sunlight. We got stuck in and muddy creating our own wild seed bombs which we 'dispersed' in the woods.

The year 3 children were challenged by Miss Archer to create waterproof shelters, they had to work in teams to gather resources, find suitable areas, plan and build. Mrs Ritchings and Miss Archer then had great fun testing how waterproof the shelters were!

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Stiperstones

A big well done to Ophelia, Logan, Jamie and Eve who competed in a National Maths Competition today. It took place online as a heat with winning schools going through to another round next month. There were hundreds of other schools online at the same time representing the West Midlands and we will hopefully find out how they got on in the next few weeks. They did really well despite some technical issues with laptops freezing with the volume of traffic to the website!

We had some great fun in science this week when investigating dissolving. We tested different materials to see if they were soluble or insoluble. Once we had found our soluble materials, we then tried to think of quicker ways to make dissolving happen - including different temperatures and stirring and size of granules. We will conclude our results in more details next week. We also defined the vocabulary of solvent, solute substance, solution, soluble and insoluble and should now be able to talk about each one!!

A big thank you to Owen who baked our Stiperstones class some cakes using the eggs that our chickens lay last week.

We are pulling names out of a hat each time we have six eggs to send home with a child. Having eaten some of the eggs myself- I can confirm they are delicious!

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Morning Drop Off Review

We have taken the decision to review the morning drop-off arrangements at our school, in response to concerns raised by parents. As always, our primary focus is to ensure the safety and well-being of all pupils.

To address these concerns effectively, the school gates will now remain closed until 8.40am. Teachers will be present on the playground to greet your children from 8.45am onwards. It is essential to note that pupils are under parental supervision until the handover at 8.45am. We have also taken onboard the comments of parents who have pupils in the main school and Reception. We entirely understand this causes some challenge but suggest dropping your eldest child at the main school first. We will support as smooth a transition as possible by ensuring staff are prompt to receive your eldest child/children at 8.45am on the main school playground.

We do recognise the potential challenges posed by the busy road in front of the school and the possibility of congestion in the car park. Rest assured; these concerns have been taken into consideration when implementing the revised drop-off arrangements.

As part of our commitment to continuous improvement, we will closely monitor the effectiveness of this new system. Should we find any shortcomings or if adjustments are deemed necessary, we will not hesitate to make the appropriate changes, if practicable. Your continued support and understanding are greatly appreciated.

Workshops


On Wednesday afternoon we will be joined by volunteers and parents, who will share their careers with us through discussions and workshops, if you feel you are able support us further, please email the office.

Finally thank you to the children, parents and teachers who came out on the day!


