VIPERS Bookmark

Your child will come home this week with a bookmark to use. This bookmark contains questions that could be used to support your child's reading at home, specifically helping develop your child's comprehension skills. The questions have split into six sections: Vocabulary, Inference, Prediction, Explain, Retrieval and Summarise with example questions provided for each key component.

As your child progresses through the year groups, they should be able to answer a range of questions within each of the six areas. A good starting point for children in reception would be to focus on the vocabulary and prediction elements of the bookmark and by the later stages of key stage 2, children should be able to tackle questions from within each area. Children could also use these bookmarks to think about different elements of the















book they are reading; also a skill which we have all been working on within our guided reading sessions.


We are kindly asking that your Kindness Kits are returned to school by Friday 4th March so that we can arrange collection and delivery.
