Nursery

We all seem to be enjoying our week in nursery.

We have had a wonderful time exploring our dinosaur swamp this week.

During our maths sessions we have been linking numerals 1 and 2 to the same amount of dinosaurs, using 2D shapes to create repeating patterns and categorising objects according to their colour.

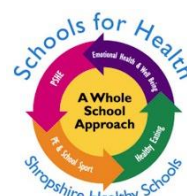
In literacy this week we have been linking musical instruments to our Gigantosaurus story.

Class 1

This week in maths the children have been busy looking at odd and even numbers. We have discussed what makes numbers odd and even and we have also practiced sharing items with a peer to check the result. The children used Numicon during their activity and the children noticed that the Numicon pieces with a flat edge were even and the ones with pointy edge were odd. Fantastic problem-solving class one. Some children amazed Mrs. Dykes and I by writing in odd and even numbers past 10. Amazing maths Class 1.

In Literacy this week we have started our dinosaur topic book called 'Gigantosaurus', the children on Monday made dinosaur eggs to hook us into the story. The children have been looking after their dinosaur eggs and this week in provision, some children have been writing sentences about their dinosaur eggs. This week we are continuing to get to know the story and the children have been developing their vocabulary, learning about the characters, and setting. On Monday we went on a hunt around the forest area for words that the dinosaurs mummy had left them. The children were excited, and we were so proud that the children were reading most tricky words by sight.

The children wanted to have a dinosaur fossils tuff tray this week which they set up with me on Friday.

Class 2

We put on our scientist hats this week and continued to observe our sunflower growth. Most of our sunflowers have grown really tall, some measuring at 14cm. We will be planting them outside next week.

We have also started created fact files on the different trees in our school grounds, this week we collected leaves, bark rubbings and photographs and next week we will be adding information about our trees.

Our Art focus this term is on Vincent Van Gough's Starry Night. We have been looking at how he creates a picture with texture and different shades. After exploring a range of techniques we will now be producing our own version of this piece of art, thinking carefully about the skills we have learnt and Van Gough's style.

Well done Gardening club.



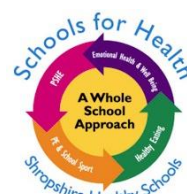
Queen's Jubilee and Moreton Say School's 150th Birthday Party - Save the Date

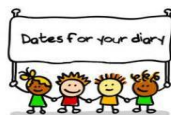


Secondary School Transport from September

Applications can be made online at <https://shropshire.gov.uk/school-transport/> or over the phone with the Council's Customer Service Team by calling 0345 6789008. Alternatively, should you require a paper copy of the application form, please do not hesitate to contact the school or Passenger Transport directly via email, schooltransport@shropshire.gov.uk or over the phone on the above telephone number. It is important to explain that, if the application is not received by **31st May 2022**, the Authority may be unable to provide transport for the beginning of the autumn term 2022 and parents/carers will need to make their own transport arrangements. Access to school transport is not permitted until entitlement has been confirmed.

Times: 8:30am - 3:30pm.

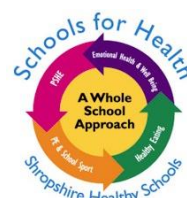
Cost: £15.00 per day or all 3 days for £40.00. VAT inclusive.
