Class 1 – Reception & Nursery

Nursery and Reception have been super busy bees over the last few weeks. For Comic Relief, the children enjoyed a red nose hunt around Forest School searching for the ten Comic Relief animal noses. We also took on the role of councillors, planning how to use census data to improve a local area. We thought really carefully about how to use the census data to help future plans for a town. We found it wasn't an easy job!

We have also really enjoyed some drama and IT learning, turning the Highwayman poem into a short film using Moviemaker. We worked hard on this, creating and making our own props and costumes and really bought the characters to life through our acting. We hope to share our work with Class 3 before the end of term, for them to evaluate.

We had fun finding out about the Hindu festival of Holi too. We learnt what Hindus remember during this festival and thought about the story of 'Prahlad and the Fire', where good conquered evil. We also researched how Hindus celebrate during this time and thought the paint throwing sounded really fun!
