




Thank you all, these spontaneous acts of kindness are the thread that keep us together.

We have been exploring ice and snow this week in nursery.

We enjoyed arctic animals in the ice tray outside, we built snowmen in the nursery garden and we went for a winter walk in the snow- using all of our senses to explore.

We have been exploring 3D shapes- Building tall London towers for our maths activities.

In provision, we explored small-world vehicles in baked beans which linked to our literacy topic, 'Naughty Bus'. The children seemed to enjoy this fun and messy activity.

We explored dinosaurs in the icing sugar (snow), creating footprints in the snow. We talked about the sizes of the footprints and the shapes we made.

This week we tasted some different fruit, we tried blueberries and raspberries this time which some children said they had never tasted before. Well done for trying everyone!

We have celebrated Chinese New Year- the year of the

rabbit by tasting some Chinese foods and discussing with

the children about festivals around the world.



Our phonics sound of the week is 'g' and the children took Bertie Bus for a ride to find objects beginning with the sound/phoneme 'g'.

<u>Lawley</u>

Another great week in Reception/ Year One. The children have been loving the lovely snowy weather. This enabled us to take our Geography lesson outside this week in the snow. The children did field work outside in the Forest with compasses to look at different directions. The aim of the lesson was to recognise what a compass is and to remember the four directions on a compass, North, South, East and West! The children loved this practical lesson in the snow and were able to remember the directions with our acronym 'Never, Eat, Shredded Wheat'

In maths we have been comparing numbers to 20 in both classes looking at numbers within 20 that are greater then and more than each other. Year one has been looking at the symbols < and >. and Reception have been ordering numbers to 20.

English this week we have been looking at settings. We watched part of The Lion King and looked at the setting based in the opening of 'The Circle of Life' the children were able to talk about adjectives of the Jungle setting and Year One went on to writing sentences about the setting using the connective 'and' to connect two sentences.

We came up with lots of investigative questions for children that might have been in that school. Teacher Industrial Action

As you may already be aware, Teaching Unions, alongside many other public sector ones, have recently been calling upon their members to engage in industrial action consisting of strike action.

The call to action follows what have been attempts by Teaching unions to express their deep concerns and dissatisfaction at the failure of the Secretary of state to make available additional and sufficient funds to allow employers to pay a fully funded increase in teachers' pay at a rate greater than inflation (as measured by September 2022 RPI).

The overwhelming majority of teachers across the AddMore Federation are NEU members and therefore, following a recent strike ballot, a significant number of staff have been called upon to take strike action now. Therefore, I would like to prepare you, with as much possible advance notice, of the potential for disruption on the following dates:

Wednesday 1st February 2023 Wednesday 1st March 2023 Wednesday 15th March 2023 Thursday 16th March 2023

I am looking at potential alternative staffing scenarios which may enable me to keep both schools open on these days and will be in touch regarding the outcomes of this in the next few days.
