We have been very busy learning about different life cycles. The children have enjoyed planting their sunflowers at Forest school and loved watching the time lapse of a sunflower seed to flower. In music the children used their bodies to recreate the life cycle of the sunflower to music. The children started off by curling up into a ball on the floor and slowly growing taller by stretching their bodies.

For literacy, in reception, the children have been writing their own stories and used their imaginations to write their own versions of The Very Hungry Caterpillar. The children have made some lovely stories and we even used some glittery material as a class stage for the children to act out their stories with their friends. In maths, the children have started looking at telling the time and sequencing their days. The children enjoyed going on a time hunt outside and found all the different clocks hidden around the ground with all the different times. The time telling skill we explored was 'O'clock and half past'.

Class 2 - Miss Jones, Mrs Burns and Mrs Williams

Class 2 have shown great responsibility this week by helping to tidy up their Forest School area. They fixed the hedgehog home, replenished the bug hotel, weeded, collected rubbish and planted bluebell bulbs; kindly donated by Elliott.

In D&T they have been designing and making bridges to help Billy Goat Gruff cross the river safely. Research time has involved researching different types of bridges and what makes them strong. The children used pillars and triangles in their own designs. Billy Goat successfully crossed every bridge without ending up in the river!



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Class 3 - Miss McLaughlin and Mrs Jones

Class 3 have been working hard to produce final drafts of their dilemma stories. I was allowed to take a sneaky preview yesterday. You are in for a treat. The children have also been identifying various mini-beasts and classifying them using branching databases. It is great to see nature, science and technology connecting in a cross-curricular learning experience.

Class 4 - Mrs Baillie and Mrs Jones

Class 4 are enjoying using our new laptops as they work to develop their computing skills further. So far this term, they have been creating their own games using Purple Mash and Scratch. It is quite a complicated process and Mrs Baillie is so impressed by the children’s ability to cope with challenging instructions and by their creativity. Mrs Rawsthorne has settled in nicely with Class 4 also. This week she has been delighted to share with me their beautiful work. The children have been exploring Llandudno as part of their seaside topic. They have been developing their map reading skills and locational knowledge. To enhance the learning experience further, they have explored scale. Their workbooks look fantastic and it is wonderful to see the children being able to use their maths skills in a real life context.
