## Class 1 – Reception & Nursery Miss Clarke, Mrs Butler and Mrs Arblaster


This week we have been focusing on a new story book, The Rainbow Fish. This has been a perfect choice as it complements their topic, Under the Sea. The children have been able to use technology to explore websites that provide information about sea creatures. The children have learnt lots of new facts and have then been able to transfer their learning into a fact file. I can't wait to see their finished pieces. In science they have been designing their own boats to see if they float or sink. They will be testing them out next week. Creating lots of cross curricular links is a great approach to teaching and it certainly makes the learning experiences more engaging and the class room looks amazing. It looks very fishy!! Nursery are also following the underwater theme. Their tuff trays are filled with sea creatures and keywords and images to aid discussions and build curiosity. 


#### Class 4 - Mrs Baillie and Mrs Jones

## **Don't forget our Upcoming Bastille Celebration Day**


