This week in nursery we have been exploring all things autumn.

We have been comparing the shapes of autumn leaves and watching as they change colour.

We enjoyed an autumn listening walk; we heard the birds singing, the trucks, an aeroplane and children singing.

We have taken part in many oral blending games and enjoyed singing and rhymes too.

In maths we have been using the language of size to discuss objects in the story 'Goldilocks and the three bears'.

In science this week, we have been exploring dark. The children were challenged to build a Dark Den, which was completely dark. We made predictions about which materials would block out the most light making the den as dark as possible, the children had to use 'because' to give reasons for their predictions to try and 'think like scientists'. We then tested our predictions to help use choose the best materials ready to build our dens. Once the den was built, we had a great time discovering just how dark it was!



In PSHE we learnt about road safety. We came up with some safety rules for our playground 'road' and practiced cycling around it and crossing it safely. Next week we will be learning













about different road crossings and the children have been challenged to spot any around our homes.

We have written speeches as if we were her, sharing a recount of her experiences. We had to think carefully about what a recount would include and how she would present these to an audience. I was really impressed with the work Stiperstones class produced.

We have also produced some wonderful work for display of her journey along the river and into the Niagara Fall waterfall- we thought about how she would be feeling at each stage and what she would be thinking.

We have also spent some time planning an action plan in science by looking at the school grounds and thinking about how our school environment could be improved. We thought carefully about how we could make our grounds environmentally friendly and how we could encourage more animal and wildlife to our grounds. We plotted our ideas onto a map of the school.
