Ercall

During maths this week our focus has been 'Me and you, one two' so we have been counting objects and sharing. We linked this to our Pathways topic and so shared bowls and spoons between two bears. We used lots of mathematical language to describe the different sizes of cups in our teddy bears picnic too!





















In our phonics sessions we have been for a listening walk where we heard a combine harvester, children talking, PE lessons on the playground, tractors and birds. We have also been oral blending with games such as, 'Can you touch your h-ea-d, can you touch your

head?'. We have enjoyed playing musical instruments, listening out for the

words, 'stop and go'.

During our literacy sessions we have been learning the story 'Peace at last'. The children have been acting out the story and creating teddy bear collages which can be seen in our topic books. Together we re-told the story of Goldilocks and the three bears using props. We have been building homes for the bears using stickle bricks and 3D shapes too!

In English we have started to create story maps based around our innovated versions of this terms focus book 'Troll Swap'. These will help us to overlearn the story and develop the vocabulary we wish to use when writing our stories next week.

Caradoc

This week has been a very maths focused week in Caradoc. The children have been learning and practicing subtracting using the column method. We have used manipulatives to investigate what happens to numbers when we rename them and how we then use this in the column method. A very tricky concept! By the end of the week all the children are now confidently using manipulatives to help them do their tricky subtractions and even sometimes using the column method independently!

In English, we have been learning about the different spelling rules when pluralising nouns and there are a lot! The children worked hard to remember these and are starting to apply this in their work.





















In Guided Reading, the children researched one aspect about the ocean and have created their own posters/leaflets to educate others, whilst in Topic, the children identified

human and physical features of the landscape around the River Severn. Another busy week! Well done Caradoc.

In other news, Ollie G was delighted to receive a letter from our Local MP, Helen Morgan this week. Ollie had written to Helen in Year 2, to express his concern over the impact climate change is having on his favourite animal, the Ethiopian Wolf. Well done Ollie for standing up for what you believe in!

Gardening Club

Life cycles. We've explored trees from seed to fruit so far and this week brings us back to the beginning again. Once the tree has fallen and starts to decay mushrooms start to pop up! I've so many in the last week. We watched a video about a mushroom farm in an old limestone mine. This included how they are grown, picked, and then packaged ready to purchase at the local shop.

























Then we went outside to plant our own mushroom kit! The children each took part in getting the straw substrate ready and we talked about pasteurization. Then William and Logan mixed in our golden oyster mushroom spawn. We had to very careful about keeping everything clean so that the mushrooms don't have any competition for nutrients. Our kit will now go into a dark cupboard so that the root system can develop and after half term we'll put it out in the light at school and everyone can watch our mushrooms grow, they might even double in size overnight! Hopefully we'll get a chance to cook and taste them.

Growing mushrooms at home is an easy project and our kit is from Urban Farm-it. There are a few to choose from and I think pink oyster mushrooms would also be exciting.

Lastly the video is from a very old TV show that I used to watch as a child in America. Mr Rogers was a fixture of children's television for decades and you can watch his back catalogue on the Mr Rogers' Neighborhood website.

To progress the arrangements for this terms activities we would like to also invite you to a 'normal' meeting next Tuesday 3rd October at 2.00pm in the Clive Hall.




























WHAT IS THE PTA?

HOW CAN I GET INVOLVED?


