

### <u>Ercall</u>

Our current pathways to write literacy topic is 'The three little pigs'. In our provision this week we have been exploring colour and texture through brick, straw and bark rubbings. Our children seemed to really enjoy painting with straw too! We have created a construction site within nursery for the children to build their own houses using boxes, straw, foam bricks and sticks- Everyone wore a hard hat and a hi-visibility jacket- Super team work Ercall!





For remembrance day we made red 'poppy' playdough with the children and scented it with ginger. We have also been developing our fine motor skills whilst threading laces through poppies. We are looking forward to the church service on Thursday to further develop our knowledge and

understanding of Remembrance.

We have been celebrating Diwali, the festival of light, through pattern craft activities and mark-making in glitter.

During our phonics sessions we have been learning objects which begin with the sound 'a' such as ant, apple, astronaut'. The children have been blending words from the box such as: 's-o-ck, a-n-t, t-a-p, p-i-g'.

On Friday we will be raising money for Children in Need. Throughout the week we have been teaching the children about Pudsey bear and completing activities to raise awareness.

### <u>Wrekin</u>

This week we have been using our number bond knowledge to support their addition work. They have been adding to the next 10 and then across 10 using concrete and pictoral methods. To help at home, knowing different bonds for numbers up to and including 10 will be a huge support.

We have enjoyed reading the start of 'Owl who was afraid of the dark' and using adjectives and adverbs in our descriptive writing.

In History we are learning about the Orville brothers and how they created the first piloted, engine-powered plane that flew for 12 seconds. We took part in some role- play to help us imagine how the people involved might have been feeling and what they might have said.

At the forest this week some of us have been using loppers with Miss Archer and some of us enjoyed exploring what sounds we could make, after reading about how ears work in Guided Reading.

In English, Caradoc have started to explore our class book "winters child" further and have planned and written a recount diary entry. The children have worked hard to included lots of writing features to make their work more interesting, including complex and compound sentences and fronted adverbials.

In maths, we have been investigating multiples. The children have worked hard, using the equipment to find out which numbers are divisible by which!

In history, we have started to explore how children's lives have changed and begun to draw comparisons, whilst in DT the children baked a simple biscuit recipe, which they will adapt later in the term.
