We are excited to continue building on our successful collaboration with the Shropshire Mental Health Support Team. Last term, Lucy from the MHST introduced herself to parents and children and began delivering a variety of mental health and well-being support across the federation, including:

- Class sessions around recognising feelings and when we feel them.
- Whole school activities supporting antibully week.
- 1:1 anxiety, worries, low mood and emotional regulation support sessions.
- Parent and family sessions based around the Cathy Creswell Model.
- Small group support focusing on 'here and now worries' and real life solutions.

This term we are excited to welcome Lucy into each school for a half day every week, this will enable her to support even more children and families in our school and community.

- Activities to support Children's mental health week in February.
- Year 6 transition support in the summer term.
- Monthly staff and governor wellbeing support sessions.
- Online and face to face parent workshops and signposting.

#### Safer Internet Day

As a school we will be celebrating Safer Internet Day on February 6th with learning and activities based around this year's theme of 'Inspiring changes? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online'. Focusing on:

- Young people's perspective on new and emerging technology
