We have a fantastic week celebrating Science and the children have loved exploring and thinking critically.

On Monday we had the most amazing morning with Fizz Pop Science, Disaster Dan helped us create so many different kinds of bubbles. We looked at how normal bubbles are made, tried to catch our own non-popping bubbles, looked at rainbow bubbles through our special refracting glasses, created giant bubbles, watched Dan carefully make fire bubbles and finally made our own fizzing sherbet bubbles. The children were fascinated, and all came out wanting to be scientists like Dan when they grow up!





























The children have also made cloud dough slime this week and added the pirate treasure and shells linked to our Pirate literacy story. The children have enjoyed exploring different textures and learning the processes of making cloud dough. 
