







During the week our nursery children have been following the literacy topic, "The Pirates are coming".

We had the most amazing trip to Blue Planet Aquarium on Wednesday. We started the day in the classroom learning about habitats and what different animals need to survive. The children really impressed staff at the aquarium with their animal knowledge, especially about how fish breath by taking oxygen out of the water! Our teacher at the aquarium also showed us lots of different shark jaws with all the rows of sharp teeth. We enjoyed watching the divers feeding the stingrays and event learnt how to say OK using diving sign language. After lunch, we had a great time exploring the aquarium. Our favourite part was the tunnels under the shark tanks.

Back in school, we have been very busy practising our singing ready for our Easter service next week. We can't wait to see you all there.

In Literacy this week we have been busy developing our sentence writing with adjectives linked to our Pirates Topic The children were able to write things that a diver might find underwater and include an adjective to go with the objects, such as Silver coins or shiny shells.



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We have been continuing to look at The Easter story in R.E and why it is an important time for Christians. This week the children learnt about symbols of Easter and Spring. We discussed these as a class and drew pictures for our class floor book.

To carry on our Science topic, some children helped make dinosaur slime this week and helped scrub the dinosaurs clean practicing fine motor skills.




Leaving at 6.15am they arrived ready to set up their amazing pit display before the opening ceremony. Throughout the day the teams presented in front of panels of judges, showed off their pit display and raced their car down the 20m track. They met industry experts from various universities and enjoyed exploring a range of technologies, including virtual reality and computer simulated testing. The team was also able to meet other students from across the country as well as two teams that had travelled all the way from Hong Kong! While the judges went away to add up the scores the team had chance to explore the science museum, before returning to hear the results of the day. The team received a nomination for 'Recognition of Achievement', but sadly didn't come away with any awards on this occasion. This didn't dampen their spirits though, and they were all incredibly proud of what they had achieved and have taken away many memories and lots of new skills from the experience.


Maths mastery workshop – Tuesday 30th April, 2pm-3pm.

Gardening and Home Crafts

This week we looked at the Native American story of The Three Sisters and how it relates to how they practice companion planting. Every tribe has its own version of the story but they weave together the same idea about planting squash, beans, and corn together.

The children had an opportunity to try fresh green beans, sweet corn, and courgette (a summer squash). They also tried corn tortillas made from blue corn which gives the food a very special colour. We talked about how eating a grain (corn, rice, etc) and a legume (beans, peas, etc) together creates a complete protein, which is important for a varied healthy diet. Meat was not always available for people who lived off the land and hunted for their meat.

Lastly we headed outside to sow seeds for our own purple French beans, courgette, and rainbow gem sweet corn.



Congratulations


