Key achievements to date (end of year 2022-2023)	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need in preparation for 2023-2024
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Swimming lessons took place during Summer Term 2023 across Key Stage 2, our end of year swimming data for Year 6 was good– we attribute this to our effective provision of lessons to all children Year 3-Year 6. - 2 hour-offer for PE is met with one-hour delivered by specialist coach for all children and a further hour delivered by staff. Further support and CPD to be offered to staff to support this. - Continued success and participation at Level 1 & 2 competition in local area; covering a breadth of sporting opportunities for both coaching and competitive level. - Our PE Curriculum enables children to take part in more intra-school events across a wider range of sports and activities. This is enhanced by extra-curricular provision which promotes a healthy lifestyle and opportunity for all. - Children had opportunities to access opportunities in areas such as archery, cycling, scooting, skateboarding using outside providers to ensure high quality provision. - Year 5 and 6 pupils all achieved Level 2 in Bikability. - Children from Reception to Year 6 competed in the Shropshire Half Marathon Challenge. - A Forest School site is used regularly for curricular and extra-curricular provision. Pupils in Early Years spent one afternoon a week in the Adderley forest school area accessing their provision. - Worked with 'Energise' to help promote an Active School ethos, encouraging children to be as physically active during the day as possible. PE equipment purchased for playtimes and lunchtimes to encourage movement and active play. - Moreton Say received the Bronze Sports Mark Award for 2022-2023. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Continue to embed and enhance monitoring systems to ensure all children are offered at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day (in line with guidance of 30 minutes in-school daily activity) - Continued focus on the impact of PE on Mental Health – plan into parts of PE curriculum – - To ensure opportunities for a range of extra-curricular clubs are provided for those delivered by both Teaching staff as well as outside agencies. Opportunities offered for 2023-2024 to include alternative sports such as fencing , archery hoola-hooping, new age curling. - Intra-house competitions to be built into the curriculum; sports day, tournaments, swimming galas - Forest School Level 3 training to be undertaken by KA at Adderley. Facilitate and develop leadership and allow for official delivery of Forest School programme to develop a whole school culture and understanding of the principles and ethos of Forest School. - CPD to support staff in PE delivery and to encourage sustainability should funding ever be cut. Some staff meetings and PD day schedules to include PE and Sport CPD for all staff. - Increase the range of After School Sports clubs available to pupils; fund outdoor providers and specialists. - Replenish outdoor play equipment for the Early Years setting which encourage active play. - Look to increase Sports Mark Award to minimum of Silver Award for 2023-2024. <p>Continue to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Provide opportunities for 'Personal Challenge' within PE lessons and competitions - Provide opportunities for non-traditional sports and inspirational sessions for all



	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Maintain and promote links with local clubs- Ensure that the 'Active Schools' ethos is still promoted throughout the school through the use of active playtimes and breaktimes, young leaders and sports club provisions. <p>How the improvements will be sustainable in the future:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Leadership will look to encouraging our school staff to work alongside external sports coaches or PE specialists. Over time, levels of 'in house' expertise will grow. This process builds capacity for a point where it may become financially necessary to reduce the involvement of external coaches.




