#### **Ercall**

We have had a wonderful week in nursery exploring the literacy topic 'Monster clothes'.

We have been pairing patterned socks and counting pants in maths following the Kate Burton planning scheme.

Outside we collected lots of leaves and began counting them using one-toone correspondence.





Our sound of the week is, 'I', we have been learning words which begin with this sound such as, 'lollipop', 'leaf' and 'lemon'.





















Together we made lemon scented playdough to help develop our fine motor skills.

Next week we will begin our new literacy topic, 'Gigantosaurus' so we have been busy making dinosaur eggs with the children.

#### <u>Lawley</u>

What a great start to the summer term. The children have come in ready to learn and really excited about our new 'Dinosaurs' topic. During 'Mat Chat' in the morning we have started talking about the day, month, season and weather linked to EYFS Understanding the World'. In English we have started looking at poetry and the poem 'Behold' by Mary

Kawena Pukui. The poem is all about our natural world. The children have been using adjectives and writing sentences about the natural world around them.

In Maths we have been consolidating learning on counting. We have been counting to 20 with our new class puppet 'Bruce'. The children have been helping Bruce think of strategies to help when counting large amounts. We looked at ticking off items we have counted or moving them away from us. When counting how many of us were in the class we discussed sitting down once we had been counted was a good method.





In PSHE this week we have been looking at screen time and how to stay healthy online and in Science we have enjoyed categorising our





















dinosaurs into different colours and properties and we now know what a herbivore, carnivore and omnivore is.

The classroom has been set up this week with lots of opportunities to learning about dinosaurs and to build on prior learning such as number formations.

In Art we have been looking at the 'Morphe' sculpture made of clay. We discussed what Clay is and where it comes from and then the children enjoyed exploring clay seeing if they could manipulate it and roll it into a ball, pinch it, etc. They made lots of great changes to their clay.

Building on our science topic of planting, they planted sunflower seeds which we will germinate ready to use in our experiments over the half term, to answer the question 'what do plants need to grow?'. For the last part of the session, all children were able to explore the forest and even built confidence with some tree climbing.

In geography, we have begun to explore our topic of 'are all settlements the same?' thinking about our local area, the different types of settlements and their features. We looked at images from different types of maps and compared the features.
