Class News

Ercall

Our sound of the week is 'i' so we have been finding words beginning with this initial sound such as 'jelly, jam, jug and jellyfish'.

We created spring trees in our topic books this week as we have been learning about the change of season. The children painted their hand and forearm to create 'a tree' then used collage materials to decorate. Well done Ercall!

The children have been really interested in our new pets at Moreton Say....we have been to visit our new chickens most days.

In our topic books we have been using paint to create dinosaur footprints. The children used their maths skills to count the footprints and name the colours.





















Last week we made 'dinosaur eggs' in nursery....the children have been excited, waiting for them to crack open. On Tuesday we helped to crack open the eggs using spoons. This was hard work but the children seemed to enjoy the challenge and have been looking after the baby dinosaurs ever since.

Our rhyme of the week is 'one, two, buckle my shoe', the children have engaged well with the rhyme and are beginning to recognise and clap syllables.

This week we have started our 'Gigantosaurus' English topic book. The children have enjoyed reading parts of the story and making predictions on the ending.

We have been looking at adjectives to describe things and we have been working on developing our sentence writing using the connective 'and'. The children have designed their very own dinosaurs this week and we have been super impressed that they have all written sentences using adjectives to describe their creations. We have also had an exciting week as we have had two dinosaur eggs appear in our classroom on Tuesday. We found a letter from the Dinosaur eggs Mummy asking if we could look after them for a little bit whilst we do our dinosaur topic. The children have been so excited and nurturing. The children are going to keep the eggs safe by keeping the noise level down in class and saying hello to them daily. We are really hoping they hatch before the end of term!!!!

In Art we have made play dough this week and discussed ingredients and then the children have been manipulating the play dough making marks and sculptures with it.

In maths we have been subitising and focusing on making 6! The children have thought of many ways to make 6. We have even looked at ten frames this week and written corresponding number sentences to go with the amount of objects in our frames.

In R.E we have been looking at what stories are special for different religions. This week we looked at the Christian story called "Jesus Calmed the Storm". The children listened well to this story and then made pictures to retell the story in order.





















In Science this week we looked at the concept of camouflage. The children started to make their own junk model dinosaurs. We are going to paint them next week in camouflaged colours to blend into our outdoor environment.

In this week's provision the children have been playing in our palaeontologist role play area looking after the fossils. The children have been practising reading sentences and matching the sentences to the correct pictures. They have also been subitising with pictures and dinosaur number eggs. We have also been practising writing words with chosen phase 3 sounds in them.

We've had a busy week finishing off and writing up some of our amazing poetry. Everyone has worked hard to focus on presentation and handwriting, resulting in some really highquality work.

In Design Technology, we have been designing our castles thinking about what defensive features we need to protect our lands. We have researched existing castles and discussed how each feature adds to the strength and protection. Next week we will be using the computer program Tinkercad to design the individual parts of our castles ready to produce nets for construction.

We had another fantastic time in the forest at Adderley this week! Year 4 children produced clay sculptures of plants, carefully including all the different parts. Year 3 built dens and used a bow saw to create medallions, they built on skills from last week to help with the construction and knot tying. All children thoroughly exploring and playing in the outdoor environment.

Like rhubarb eating too much of the plant will give you a tummy ache but it's a lovely garnish for cakes and salads.




Congratulations
