#### **Multiplication Tables Check**

Please find attached alongside this week's Newsletter a Parent's Leaflet explaining the Multiplication Check all pupils in Year 4 will take, nationally, in the Summer Term.

The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will also help your child's school to identify if your child may need additional support.

Children across the school will be given ample support to practice their times tables throughout their time in school' not only in Year 4. However we plan to further support your child's learning of the times tables in a way which is both fun and engaging with the use of a new programme called 'Times Table Rock Stars or TT Rock stars!'. Passwords will be issued to every child meaning that not only can the times tables be practised at school but also at home using either your internet browser or by downloading the App. Free trials are available if anyone is eager and would like to give it a go!

If internet access is an issue, as can be at times, please inform your child's teacher and alternative times tables practice can be provided. Keep an eye out for passwords and usernames in the weeks to come!

### Eco Team update...

Eco-council are doing great and have lots in the pipeline. As part of our work towards the Green Flag Award we are required to include regular items in the newsletter. This week we are sharing a 'Energy Saving' Top Tip!














Although we saw a very slight decrease in the number of positive cases between 19-25 November, Shropshire still has the second highest infection rate in the West Midlands.
