

Covid-19 Update

The self-isolation period for people who test positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) will be cut to five full days from Monday 17 January. People will be able to leave isolation after producing negative lateral flow device (LFD) test results on days five and six of their isolation. As a federation we will be reviewing and updating our coronavirus-related risk assessments and procedures for the recording of absences with this new information.

There has been some confusion within the Education Sector this week regarding the DfE's advice for confirmatory PCR tests for people with coronavirus symptoms. However, in its email to schools yesterday, the department confirmed that **neither asymptomatic nor symptomatic individuals need to arrange confirmatory PCR tests after receiving positive LFD test results.** This is in line with the UK Health Security Agency's 'Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection'.


