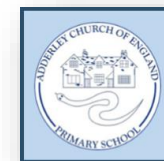


# Moreton Say CE Primary School PE and School Sport

Key achievements to date (end of year 2020-21)	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need in preparation for 2021-2022
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Inter school competitions were on-hold due to Covid-19. Moreton Say has remained however engaged and committed to the delivery of school sport and competitive opportunities.</li> <li>- Swimming lessons took place during Summer Term 2021, our end of year swimming data for Year 6 was good– we attribute this to our effective provision of lessons to all children Reception-Year 6.</li> <li>- 2 hour-offer for PE is met with one-hour delivered by specialist coach for all children and a further hour delivered by staff. Further support and CPD to be offered to staff to support this.</li> <li>- Continued success and participation at Level 1 &amp; 2 competition in local area; covering a breadth of sporting opportunities for both coaching and competitive level.</li> <li>- Our PE Curriculum enables children to take part in more intra-school events across a wider range of sports and activities. This is enhanced by extra-curricular provision which promotes a healthy lifestyle and opportunity for all.</li> <li>- Lockdown teaching provision received positive feedback including the effort towards PE and keeping active including PE tasks twice-weekly with a variety of resources used e.g. Cosmic Yoga and daily mile</li> <li>- A Forest School site is used regularly for curricular and extra-curricular provision.</li> <li>- Development of outside Early Years area – encourages regular activity and access to the outdoors areas,</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- During the academic year September 2020 – July 2021 considerable disruption occurred to our planned provision. Inter school competitions were cancelled and school clubs were unable to operate. We propose to rebuild inter-school competition into our PE &amp; sports provision post-Covid.</li> <li>- Enhance monitoring systems to ensure all children are offered at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day (in line with guidance of 30 minutes in-school daily activity)</li> <li>- Continued focus on the impact of PE on Mental Health – plan into parts of PE curriculum</li> <li>- To ensure opportunities for a range of extra-curricular clubs are provided</li> <li>- Intra-house competitions to be built into the curriculum.</li> <li>- Invest in Forest School Leader CPD for member of staff at Moreton Say</li> <li>- Provide 'Bike Ability' and Road Safety Awareness training for pupils in KS2.</li> <li>- CPD to support staff in PE delivery and to encourage sustainability should funding ever be cut.</li> <li>- Increase the range of After School Sports clubs available to pupils; fund outdoor providers and specialists.</li> <li>- Replenish playground equipment.</li> </ul> <p>Continue to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Provide opportunities for 'Personal Challenge' within PE lessons and competitions</li> <li>- Provide opportunities for non-traditional sports and inspirational sessions for all</li> <li>- Maintain and promote links with local clubs</li> </ul> <p>How the improvements will be sustainable in the future:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Leadership will look to encouraging our school staff to work alongside external sports coaches or PE specialists. 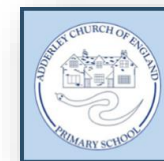
	<p>become financially necessary to reduce the involvement of external coaches.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- The money spent on the Astro turf and storage are single investments that will benefit the children in the years to come.</li></ul>
