Class News

Nursery

This week in nursery we have been exploring our new dinosaur role-play area with small-world dinosaurs, mark-making dinosaur checklists and dressing up in safari clothes.

We are continuing to explore our Gigantosaurus story during literacy sessions and have had lots of fun with our dinosaur related topics.



















The story Gigantosaurus contains lots of 'hide and seek' adventures and we have had fun playing it in nursery too!

We also played number hide and seek in the garden using numerals 1 and 2.

During our maths sessions this week we have also been exploring size, shape and patterns.

We used a wide variety of mark-making tools to explore creating patterns with paint.

At forest school this week we played dinosaur hide and seek which links to our current topic 'dinosaurs'.

We have made more progress in our nursery herb garden and the children have been exploring using all of their senses.

Class 1

This week the children have been finishing off reading The Barefoot Earth Poem 'Behold' by Mary Kawena Pukui. The children have been outside on a listening walk this week engaging with nature and looking above and below in the Forest School Area. Once we did this, the children came back into class to write their own poem verses based on nature in the school grounds. The children wrote some lovely verses and even used adjectives to enhance their sentences and poems.

In maths this week, the children have been exploring 'odd and even' numbers. We have been making patterns and using Numicon to represent odd and even numbers.

In science we have been investigating Dinosaurs and categorising them by their properties such as are they carnivore or herbivore? Big or small? Do they have longs necks etc. The children enjoyed watching a video all about The Dinosaurs and we had a big class discussion about them. The children have continued to explore The Dinosaur tuff tray set out for them to explore these properties more deeply.

This week the EYFS staff have finished The Dinosaur Park role play area and it looks fantastic. The children have been engaged playing, narrating, writing, and exploring everything about Dinosaurs and today we made dinosaur eggs as part of our new Giganotosaurus Pathways book.

Class 2

Another busy week in our classroom as we continue to watch our sunflowers and cress grow. We are keeping a weekly diary to study the changes of our sunflower seeds over time. Our bulb experiment continues, where we have placed some bulbs in the light and some are hidden away in a dark cupboard. We have made predictions about which ones will grow.

In Maths, we are moving onto time, we will explore before, after and during as well as telling the time to the five-minute. We will also be able to work out the duration of activities by looking at the start and finish times on an analogue clock. Alternatively, should you require a paper copy of the application form, please do not hesitate to contact the school or Passenger Transport directly via email, schooltransport@shropshire.gov.uk or over the phone on the above telephone number. It is important to explain that, if the application is not received by 31st May 2022, the Authority may be unable to provide transport for the beginning of the autumn term 2022 and parents/carers will need to make their own transport arrangements. Access to school transport is not permitted until entitlement has been confirmed.
