Microsoft Teams

We are now using Microsoft Teams regularly in school for virtual meetings. We are conducting weekly Federation Worship via Teams, which the children are loving as they can see themselves on the big screen in their classroom. It is allowing them to have more contact with other 'bubbles'.

Going forward, we would like to use this tool more with parents to conduct video calls, including review meeting and parents' evenings. If you are familiar with using Facetime or WhatsApp video calls it is not much different, but its advantage is that it allows us to connect via the internet rather than a phone. If parents would like to use this method of communication, we would be grateful if parents could download the Microsoft Teams App. 1 am happy to send parents who would like to try it out, a link so you can get to know how to use it.

Celebration Worship: Friday mornings at 10:30am

Each week we celebrate 'Star of the Week' in our Friday Worship on Teams. From after half term we would like to invite parents of our 'Stars' for that week to join us virtually on Teams. This means you will be contacted to let you know that your child has been awarded the prize the week before (you will need to keep this secret until Friday when you join us). We realise that this may not be possible for all parents as they may be working. There is a record facility on Teams that will allow us to record the session and share a link later. Which we can do for those parents who cannot make it. You will need the Teams App to take part in this new initiative.



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Parents' Evening

We will be conducting Parents' Evenings in the first few weeks straight after half term, either via a Microsoft Teams video call or a telephone call depending on your preference. Appointment times will be offered to you shortly.

Website

We are delighted to announce that our new website is now live on the internet.

Content is being added all the time and we will alert you to new features as they come online. We are hoping that by the end of the week, we can offer a Parents' Evening booking service via the website but will send out our usual paper booking options too if necessary.

Newsletters and general letters which have been sent out from school are also downloadable from the new website, as are common forms e.g. medical forms, leave of absence forms etc. If you think there is something else useful we could add to the site, please let us know.

The site will gradually look more vibrant as we are able to add photos to each page.

Please return your video permission for the website as soon as possible if you haven't done so already, as we plan to shoot videos and take photos after half term. Any pupils whose permission we do not have will not be able to be included.

School Meals

We have worked hard this term to find a way to offer hot meals again after half term. Due to logistical restrictions related to Covid we will only be offering one hot option each day or a packed lunch with two sandwich choices. The menu is attached to the newsletter email and is also downloadable from our new website.

Non-uniform Days: merit rewards

As part of our behaviour rewards system, children are awarded merits for good learning and good behaviour, which shows they are adhering to our Golden Rules and setting a good example to others. Each child is in a team. The merits for each team are collated each half term and

And finally...


Our number one concern is to ensure that children are attending school and are happy and eager to learn and that staff and children alike are safe during this challenging time.

Class 2 have enjoyed looking at non-fiction texts this week. We have used a text 'Toys from the Past' to look at the different sections of non-fiction, such as captions, headings, contents, index and glossary. We used the texts to find out information and are now creating our own posters about school using information we have researched. In Forest School, we have been exploring the trees on our school grounds; collecting and identifying leaves and seeds and making leaf and bark rubbings. We can name several different trees and plants and can also talk about the difference between deciduous and nondeciduous trees.

Class 3 have particularly enjoyed our Science and topic work this week. In Science, we have been investigating shadows and how they move and change throughout the day. We had lots of fun mapping a shadow on the playground by drawing around it in chalk every hour. We talked about how the position of the sun in the sky was changing the shadows and why they were 'moving'. Sometimes the shadows moved before we had finished drawing them!

In topic, we learnt about the 'Great Fire of Market Drayton', which like the Great Fire of London, started in a bakery in the town. We created some artwork to show what it may have been like!
