We are having a wonderful week in nursery.

In provision this week we have been exploring shape and numerals in the sand tray.

We have been developing our fine motor skills using tweezers in the pasta and bug tray.

We explored dinosaurs outside in the tuff tray which was fantastic fun, following the children's interests.

The children heard and used lots of new language to describe the dinosaurs and their habitats.

We also created a bug hotel indoors using pine cones, sticks, hay, straw, pumpkins and large plastic insects. Well done everyone, super exploration!















In literacy this week we have been mark-making in our topic books. We thought about foods which the anteater might like to eat and drew them in our special books. Super effort!

In the forest this week we created wiggly worms using sticks, pipe cleaners and string/woolgood hand-eye co-ordination!

In maths this week we have been painting ladybirds and counting their spots.

We have also baked mince pies in nursery this week- the children seemed to enjoy measuring the ingredients out and there was a lot of discussion about shape throughout.

<u>Lawley</u>

This week in Lawley class we are starting to get Christmassy. We have changed our stop motto to "Crackers and Cheese, Everybody Freeze". We have been talking about why Christmas is important to Christians in R.E. This week the children in Year One wrote a prayer to Baby Jesus, whilst Year Reception looked at what they are thankful for over the Christmas period. The children are really confident with the characters and plot in The Christmas Nativity Story.

In maths we have been busy looking at subtraction and counting back. The children in both year groups used a number track to answer differentiated subtraction questions. We have been discussing the symbols - and =.







In phonics Year Reception have started looking at the digraphs 'sh', 'ch', 'ng' and nk. The children have been progressing from CVC words to starting to write short captions with finger spaces and full stops. Year One has been looking at split digraphs a-e, e-e, i-e, o-e, u-e. Another great week Reception and Year One.

<u>Wrekin</u>

This week we have been really focusing on what a sentence is and what it must contain. We have been using adverbs and adjectives to make our descriptions more exciting and developed our understanding of when to use a comma. We have written some great descriptions about fireworks this week.

In Maths we have been exploring efficient methods to subtract across 10, including exchanging 1 ten for 10 ones and dividing the subtrahend to get to the nearest 10. We have also used number lines to show our working out pictorially.

In Geography we have been thinking about our homes and where they fit in the wider world, we have been learning our address and looking at key words such as town, street, county, continent and hemisphere.
